

AAC Soldier Class Three continued

- Supervision: All Class 3 soldiers require supervision.

AAC Soldier Class Two

- Having efficiently performed the duties of an AAC Soldier Class Three for 12 months.
- In addition to the tasks carried out at Class 3 level assists in:
 - Organisation of the Command Post.
 - Identifies ECM techniques and applies counter measures.
 - Carries out periodic inspections and servicing of unit vehicles.
- Supervision: Works without supervision.

AAC Soldier Class One

- Must have completed 12 months as a Class 2 soldier before being considered for upgrading.
- In addition to the tasks carried out at Class 2 level:
 - Installs, operates and maintains all radios, ancillaries and line equipment, in the unit.
 - Sets up and organises the Command Post including marking of battle maps and controlling a radio net.
 - Supervises maintenance of communications equipment in the sub unit.
 - Production of sub unit communications electronic instructions.
 - Issue, storage and safeguarding of equipment, stores and documents.
 - Supervises servicing of unit vehicles. Assists REME tradesmen in the repair and maintenance of vehicles.
 - Allots vehicles and drivers to tasks.
 - Supervises refuelling of aircraft from an aircraft refuelling vehicle.
 - Practices fuel husbandry.
 - Carries out aircraft documentation procedures for fuel issue.
 - Organisation and setting up of a landing point by day and night acting as the Landing Point Commander.
 - Supervises a marshalling team.
 - Supervises the laying out of night landing aids.
 - Supervises aircraft crash rescue teams.
 - Maintains a duty groundcrew roster.
 - Supervises aircraft handling.
 - Supervises underslung load procedures by day and night.
 - Supervises a Forward Arming and Refuelling Point.
