## Qualifications and Training

Having achieved the required standard of training and with practical experience, the above named soldier is qualified at

## AAC Soldier Class Three

- Able to drive and maintain landrovers and light goods vehicles including Tactical Aircraft Refuellers. Drives with or without trailers on roads and cross country. Possess adequate mechanical skills appropriate to their trade class. Holds a C&E driving licence.
- Trained in Hazardous Materials (HAZMAT) handling modules 1, 2, 2A, 3, 4 and 6.
- \* Carries out daily servicing drills and sets-up, operates and maintains certain types of radio set (HF, VHF, UHF) in the unit.
- Operates central battery charging when necessary.
- Selects sites and erects antennae for assigned frequencies. Applies line theory to cover given areas of operations and locates and rectifies line faults.
- Sites rebroadcast stations, acts as relay and rebroadcast operator and installs remote control facilities.
- Sends and receives radio messages, maintaining communications security and using codes.
- Carries out a range of security duties.
- Training given will enable them to navigate by map and compass and to recognise a range of foreign military vehicles and aircraft.
- Carries out groundcrew tasks, including:
  - Helicopter handling - marshalling, moving, picketing and assisting with camouflaging.
  - Helicopter husbandry - cleaning and refuelling.
  - Assists in the preparation of landing sites.
  - Local air traffic control procedures.
  - Fire/crash rescue duties.
  - Changing role equipment on aircraft.
  - Loading of aircraft - internal and external.
  - Rigging of loads for Support Helicopters. Qualified as a Rigger Marshaller.
